Peach Blossom Tour Of North Merced County UC Cooperative Extension

Peach orchards are a treat for the eye when viewed up close. There are two types of peach blossoms – non-showy varieties with tiny reddish flowers, and showy varieties that have a larger pink bloom. This route attempts to take you past several showy type orchards. On your journey you may spot small trees with white blossoms that look different from almond trees – those are likely to be plum trees. Farmers are proud of their orchards but you should always get permission before entering private property. Peach bloom peaks approximately March $10 \pm one$ week.

Begin at the Collier Rd/Bloss Ave. overpass south of Delhi.

Go west on Bloss Ave.

Turn right and go north on Griffith

Turn right and go east on Bradbury over the freeway

Turn left and go north on Cortez Ave one block

Turn right and go east on Lombardy and cross the RR tracks

Turn right and go south-east on Santa Fe through Ballico

Turn left and go east on Bradbury

Turn right and go south on Alves

Turn right and go west on El Capitan

Turn left and go south on Santa Fe to the stop sign in Cressey

Turn left and go east on Meadow Drive till it ends

Turn left and go north on Shaffer one block

Turn right and go east on Fisher

Turn right and go south on Buhach

Turn right and go west on Mercedes

Turn left and go south on Winton Way one block

Turn right and go west on Eucalyptus, cross Santa Fe

Turn left and go south on Central to Fruitland where the tour ends

To the freeway:

You can continue to the Freeway and turn right to go north.

To go south you can turn left on Fruitland and go east into Atwater and go south on Winton Way to the Freeway.
